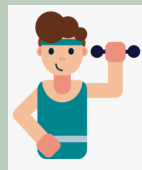
PE Days

In English this term, we'll be basing our writing initially on 'The Lost Words', which is a beautiful poetry book about wildlife and nature. It will definitely inspire us to write our own acrostic poems. Here's an alliterative example:

Our science unit this half term is 'Living things and their habitats'. Children will be taught to recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways (animals/plants, vertebrates/invertebrates, insects/mammals etc) and will also learn to use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in our local area.

Lots of fractions this half term. We find out how to order and compare them along with equivalences. We'll also be adding and subtracting fractions and delving deeper into efficient methods for finding fractions of quantities. More work on decimals comes towards the end of half term. As ever, times table practice is vitally important and we would encourage your child to practise at least 3 times a week at home.
