A reminder that Year 5 PE days are on Wednesdays and Fridays, when children can wear their kit in to school.



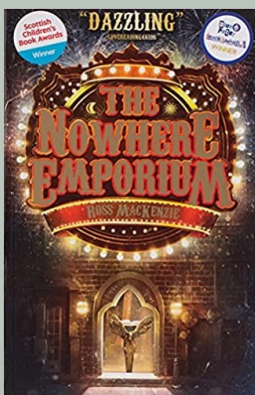
Reading

Our novel for this half term is *The Nowhere Emporium* by Ross MacKenzie. This story is about a orphaned boy who finds a mysterious shop that appears one day. He decides to work for the shop, ending up on a magical journey full of twists, turns and interesting characters!

In our reading lessons, we will be focussing on a variety of skills, such as retrieving answers from different texts, and inferring characters thoughts, feelings and emotions. We will be looking at different ways to apply these skills.

Writing

Our first writing unit this half term is narrative. We will be using our class novel 'The Nowhere Emporium' as a inspiration for some brilliant setting descriptions. Through this work, we will develop our understanding of figurative language and choosing precise vocabulary. The second half of Spring 2 will be spent creating a diary entry.





Maths

This half term, we will begin by exploring percentages, what the % symbol represents and use this knowledge to solve problems. We will then move onto studying geometry including shapes, angles and investigating perimeters of shapes.

Alongside our morning lessons, we will continue to develop our mathematical fluency each day, recapping prior learning and reinforcing our calculation skills.

Science

This half term we will continue our work with properties of materials and then move on to investigate forces practically. Each week we will be working scientifically to answer questions and test hypothesis.

DT

This half term, we will be learning about healthy, seasonal food. We will find out where our food comes from, how it is processed, and its nutritional value. We will finish off the half term by making a delicious spring soup.

History

This half term we will be learning about all things Mayan! By the end of the half term, we will know who the Mayans were, when they lived and their impact on the modern world.

Computing

This half term's computing is all about animation and using different programs for a purpose. To apply these skills, we will be producing a stop-motion animation based on our class novel or the Mayans.
