Writing

We have covered many genres of writing across the school year but this final half term allows us to concentrate on story telling. We'll be using our class read, The Time Travelling Cat and the Egyptian Goddess, as a stimulus to tell a first person narrative and a time portal narrative! As the story is half set in ancient Egypt, we'll be able to use our knowledge gained from history lessons to help with setting descriptions. In our final independent write of the school year, children will be given the freedom to set their time portal stories wherever they like—we can't wait to see what they produce!



Reading

Our new class read is The Time Travelling Cat and the Egyptian Goddess. It tells the story of Topher and his father who take in a stray cat, Ka. Topher becomes very attached to Ka and is puzzled by her mysterious absences. One day when he is playing a computer game with an Egyptian theme, Ka jumps on the keys and spells out the name Bubastis, which was the centre of cat worship in Ancient Egypt. Could Ka really be leading a double life and what is she trying to tell Topher? It ties in beautifully with our history topic—Ancient Egypt—which itself builds on our geography topic from the start of summer term. We'll have Ancient Egyptian experts by the end of the school year!







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<u>Art</u>

In Art, we will be back to our Egyptian theme and making clay Canopic jars which had quite a

gruesome role to play in Ancient Egypt and we will be revealing this to the children in this art unit!



History

We will add to our geographical and topographical knowledge when we study the Ancient Egyptian civilisation in History this half term. We'll even try mummifying something—any volunteers?!
